Seamless Transition Program

STP is a three-week high school-to-college bridge program to be held July 11 - August 1, 2009.

Offered to entering WVU freshmen, STP gives students the opportunity to begin their university education in the summer following their high school graduation.

STP students earn up to seven credit hours; benefit from classes of 15 or fewer students; live in a WVU residence hall; receive personal support from experienced faculty, staff, and live-in tutors; and learn about WVU and college life in a structured program.

STP also offers a real college experience, but with the supervision of experienced staff. Students who participate in STP enter the fall semester well-prepared for the rigors of college life and with the time management and study skills that are so important to college success.



The cost of STP includes tuition (excluding books and fees), room and board (all meals and lodging), and access to all of WVU's facilities (libraries, recreation centers, transportation, computer labs).

Tuition Costs for STP 2009*

Cost per credit hour for WV resident students: \$214

Cost per credit hour for non-resident students: \$658

Room and Board Costs for STP 2009*

Cost for STP students staying in residence hall: \$760

Cost for STP students commuting from home: \$480

Classes

Classes run from Monday through Saturday. All students are required to take a 3-credit orientation course, which fulfills the WVU requirement for University 101. In addition, students select one of the following courses:

Chemistry 110, Intro to Chemistry

(2 credit hours, qualifying score on the QRA, which must be taken during New Student Orientation).

Human Nutrition & Foods 171, Intro to Human Nutrition

(3 credit hours, no prerequisites). HN&F 171 is required for many majors and fulfills a General Education Curriculum requirement for many others. HN&F 171 covers nutrition and its importance to human well-being during all stages of the life cycle.

Humanities 107, Humanities of Egypt

(3 credit hours, no prerequisites). HUM 107 fulfills a General Education Curriculum requirement for most majors. Hum 107 focuses on the culture and history of Egypt from ancient until modern times.

Mathematics 126, College Algebra

(3 credit hours, qualifying score for placement into 126B or 126C on QRA, which must be taken during New Student Orientation). MATH 126 is required by many majors as a basic math course needed for graduation.

Mathematics 153, Calculus 1a with Precalculus

(4 credit hours, qualifying score on the QRA, which must be taken during New Student Orientation). MATH 153 is the first part of a two-semester sequence of calculus with review. Calculus is required for a variety of majors.

Music 179, Music in World Cultures

(3 credit hours, no prerequisites). MUSC 179 fulfills a General Education Curriculum requirement for many majors. An interactive examination of music from various cultures (e.g. Native America, South India, Japan, Africa) within their cultural contexts.

Psychology 101, Intro to Psychology

(3 credit hours, no prerequisites). PSYC 101 fulfills a General Education Curriculum requirement and is required by many majors. Survey of general psychology.
